TERMS AND CONDITIONS TO ERECT SCAFFOLDING ON THE PUBLIC HIGHWAY

HIGHWAYS ACT 1980 - SECTION 169

LICENCE CONDITIONS

1. The Licence shall subsist for a period of 30 days
2. A footway width of not less than 1.5 metres and a height of not less than 2.4 metres shall remain clear to provide unobstructed pedestrian access, unless other arrangements are agreed with the Highway Authority and confirmed in writing
3. The scaffolding (and the footway) shall be maintained in a good condition to the Council's satisfaction until such time as the Council shall require or consent to the removal thereof and shall be adequately lit at all times between half an hour after sunset and half an hour before sunrise
4. The Licensee shall comply with any written direction of the Highway Authority with respect to the erection and maintenance of traffic signs in connection with the scaffolding
5. While a scaffold is being erected, signs should be prominently displayed stating that scaffolding is incomplete
6. Scaffolding must not obstruct access by emergency services vehicles
7. All standards up to a height of 2.0 metres should be sleeved or wrapped with red and white warning markings
8. Reasonable requests from Utility Companies for the purpose of protecting or giving access to any apparatus belonging to or maintained by the said companies must be complied with
9. No part of the scaffolding erected on highway land may be used for the purpose of advertising other than the particulars of the contractor on site. The company responsible for the scaffolding must have their sign with address and or telephone number erected on the scaffolding
10. The erection and dismantling and operation of any scaffolding must comply with the requirements of Health and Safety, Work Act Management of Health and Safety at Work Regulations 1999, Provision and Use of Work Equipment Regulations 1998, Construction (Health, Safety and Welfare) Regulations 1996
11. Licensee shall indemnify the Highway Authority for the cost of repair and reinstatement of the highway as a result of any damage caused by or resulting from the use of the scaffolding
12. Licensee shall indemnify the Highway Authority against all third party claims resulting from the erection or use of the scaffolding
13. Debris netting to be fitted to the scaffold as standard
14. The scaffold must comply with the standards laid down in the Work at Height Regulations 2005
15. All street lighting, signs and furniture are not to be enclosed within or obscured by the scaffolding
